Texts: *Fabulae Graecae* (our workbook; required). A good Latin-English dictionary and a systematic grammar are strongly recommended. *English Grammar for Students of Latin,* invaluable for those without a strong foundation in English grammar, is available in the campus bookstore.

Examinations: Short quizzes every class period, three midterms, and a final exam. There will be *no make-up quizzes*, and quizzes missed will count as F's. A number of quizzes will be dropped before averaging the final quiz grade. The quiz grade will be weighted as an exam. Midterms must be taken in class at their scheduled times. In cases of foreseeable conflicts of schedule students who wish to take a make-up exam must notify me *before* the regularly scheduled exam. Only major and documented emergencies are excepted from this. This rule will be inflexibly enforced.

Class participation may be decisive in determining a borderline grade.

Attendance at every class is essential for successful work. Students are responsible for all material covered in class, exercises assigned as homework, and for memorization of vocabulary and grammar.
