Demonstrative adjectives will, of course, agree with the noun they modify in number, case and gender:

Puer has pueras pulsat - *The boy beats these girls.*

Puellae hos pueros pulsant - *The girls beat these boys.*

The demonstrative adjective may also act as a pronoun (in substitution for a noun):

Puer has pulsat - *The boy beats them* (feminine).

Vir haec dicit - *The man says these things* (neuter plural).
